## **Are Further Mortgage Changes Coming?**



Within the last 2 years, the Canadian housing market has been affected by the Government's regulation changes, reducing maximum amortization periods for High Ratio Mortgages. Under the old system, High Ratio mortgages were allowed a maximum 30 year amortization. This meant a larger number of people could afford home ownership. The new maximum amortization period of 25 years means people who once could qualify for home-ownership, have now been pushed out of the market.

The Office of the Superintendant of Financial Institutions (OSFI) has verified that they are looking at whether amortization periods should be limited on Conventional Mortgages as well. The new maximum amortization period they are proposing is 25 years. Currently, many

institutions will allow for as high as 40-years amortization on a Conventional Mortgage.

So how will our members be affected? This change may not affect our members who opt for traditional 25-year amortization on their conventional mortgage when they purchase or refinance a property. There are many members however, that rely on longer amortizations to help facilitate a purchase or refinance. This may be due to a family situation causing their income to be temporarily lowered, or maybe some senior members whose fixed incomes can't support a lower amortization during these reverse mortgage years.

Members who have purchased or refinanced prior to regulatory changes in the past have been grandfathered and can continue under the old rules until they refinance again. The Credit Union can assist members who may be concerned over these possible upcoming regulatory changes, and how it may negatively

impact them. We can also help members with a refinance prior to these proposed changes taking place.

OSFI has said that it will not make any changes until it has consulted with the Industry. Please check the Credit Union's website or visit our blog on an ongoing basis for industry changes that may affect you.

Members are encouraged to contact the Credit Union to determine if your current mortgage amortization is right for you. Don't wait until after regulation changes restrict you from the Financial Freedom you deserve.
